An open letter to teachers and public employees:

Campaign season is in full bloom and with it the panoply of confusion and half-truths.

Rob Astorino has run a campaign of deception and cheap tricks. He recently sent a letter to teachers claiming to be a friend of the teachers. And today, he's claiming to be a friend of public employees. Rob Astorino should be <u>enemy number one</u> for teachers and public employees. Just ask any teacher or public employee in Westchester what he did to teachers and public employees there. He is a stalwart and proud anti-union executive.

Rob Astorino brought Scott Walker to New York for an Astorino fundraiser and said Walker has set the model that New York should follow. He believes the public unions are the heart of the state's problems. So he wants to roll back public employees and teachers' rights.

Rob Astorino may say he is for public education, but he would like to see charter schools replace public schools and is a rabid "privatization" advocate. He is no moderate Republican but rather the harshest brand of ultraconservative New York has seen. It was Governor Cuomo who advocated and signed the Common Core moratorium bill. As far as "respect" is concerned, the Governor's mother was a public school teacher and his daughter attends public school.
