A1. Getting Members Involved in the Union

Presenter: Lynda Larson, Labor Relations Specialist, Suffolk Regional

The privitization of public hospitals, the "business model" changes in healthcare by the insurance industry, and the industrialization of nursing and other healthcare practices by non-healthcare professionals in schools are just some of the reasons why we need strong, powerful healthcare locals. Membership involvement is critical. This session discusses how to motivate members to become actively involved in the union and strategies to build member activism at the worksite, and in the local.

A2. HPV Vaccine and Adolescent Gynecology - CEU Credit Presenter: Ellen McTigue, Nurse Practitioner, Gynecologic Oncology Service, Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Downstate Medical Center

This is an opportunity to learn about the new HPV Human Papilloma Vaccine developed to offer protection against four HPV types, which together cause 70% of cervical cancers and 90% of genital warts. Before youngsters become sexually active, this vaccine provides protection and immunity against most types of HPV and cervical cancer. In addition, there will be discussion on adolescent gynecology questions and concerns.

A3. SPEAK - Train-the-Trainer on Suicide Prevention Education Awareness Kit - CEU Credit Presenter: John Kelly, Ph.D., School Psychologist, President - New York Association of School Psychologists

SPEAK is an information kit published by the NYS Office of Mental Health designed to educate the public, health care providers and educators in the recognition of early symptoms of depression and strategies for prevention of teen suicide. Workshops have been developed by the New York Association of School Psychologists based upon the SPEAK material. In these workshops, there is information about suicide and suicide prevention, the risk factors and the warning signs, and resources about how to seek help. Workshops are focused on training school staff at an elementary, middle, and high school level. In addition, there is a "peer" training module for middle and high school students, parent training module for middle and high school aged students, as well as a module focused on depression in adults. This workshop is a train-thetrainer session on all five modules, including a demonstration of one of the modules. At the conclusion of the workshop, participants will leave the session with a set of the materials in print and electronic formats.

A4. Safe Oxygen Administration -**CEU Credit**

As a nation, we are in a period of reflection as to what can be done to stem the tide of violence in our school communities. Though some may characterize these incidents as happening "out of the blue", the tragedy is they don't. In most cases, long before children move into the danger zone, there were clear and compelling signs of serious trouble, signs that no one saw or recogonized.

Join us for a workshop on the psychology of dangerousness in children. Learn the signs and signals of trouble. Learn about at-risk behaviors and characteristics. Learn how to handle children in distress. Learn how to prevent trouble down the road.

This session provides a review of the provisions of the Health Insurance Portability and accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA). HIPAA requirements apply to health care providers who submit claims electronically, all health plans including private and government programs and health care clearing houses. 




