Classroom-Up Educational Reform: Why We Need Teacher-Driven Professional Networks in Education

This presentation outlines the work several English teachers and one teacher educator have done to develop The Western New York Network of English Teachers (WNYNET), a teacher driven professional network connecting English teachers across the Buffalo-Niagara region. Teacher-leaders will share their experiences building the organization and discuss how this work has impacted their teaching. Resources for forming similar organizations for other content areas and grade levels will be shared.

For the past 6 years WNYNET has worked to professionalize local English teachers by providing them opportunities to share their teaching practices at ongoing local and national conferences. The organization also connects over 350 educators through social media so they can engage in professional discussions and share instructional resources with one another. Additionally the network supports local schools by providing authentic, extensive mentoring for pre-service and early career teachers by inducting them into a community of practice that values, encourages, and supports meaningful teaching. In total, this teacher led organization works to transform the teaching of English language arts in Western New York by connecting, supporting, and empowering educators across our region.
