SRP Leadership Conference goes virtual for 2020

The SRP Leadership Conference will be held virtually this year, in consideration of continuing COVID-19 pandemic gathering restrictions.

The conference, delivered by Zoom, will be held Oct. 23–25, 2020, beginning with the opening session on the evening of Friday, Oct. 23.

“We wanted to make this conference as convenient as we could for NYSUT School-Related Professionals leaders,” said NYSUT Second Vice President Ron Gross, whose office oversees SRP issues for the union. “We are pleased that we could offer the original dates in a virtual format; keeping the health and safety of our SRP members and NYSUT staff at the forefront.”

There is still time to register for the 2020 SRP Leadership Conference.

The 2019 SRP Leadership Conference sold out, but this year’s virtual conference has more seats



available. There is no cost to locals, but local leaders need to register their participants. Participants will be entered for chances to win other prizes depending upon how many workshops they complete. Interested emerging and veteran unionists may view the workshop

Friday, Oct. 23, is the opening session, which includes a Member Benefits presentation, a plenary session and a Member Benefits basket raffle.

organizing, special education concerns, social emotional well-being, union advocacy, communications and more.

On Sunday, Oct. 25, the morning session is a roundtable for local presidents and chapter chairs.

But resilient SRPs have continued to step up to the challenge of educating students remotely, preparing food and delivering it to students offsite, keeping the buildings clean, providing clerical support off and onsite. The photos at right show some of the ways SRP made a difference in the spring and summer and continue to do so during the phased in re-opening.

Mark Warner, a teaching assistant and member of the Syracuse Teachers Association, used his engaging photography in his work.

“My classroom teacher asked to use some of my photos in writing prompts for students,” said Warner, who provided the lion picture at right, along with several others, to ignite student imagination.

NYSUT President Andy Pallotta visited several SRP locals, including Albany Public Schools United Employees Association and Central Valley United Employees, and saw first hand how SRPs make a difference in their schools and communities during the pandemic.
