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BYLAW

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CONSTITUTION

OF THE

NEW YORK STATE UNITED TEACHERS

ARTICLE I NAME

1 This organization shall be known as the 2 New York State United Teachers ("NYSUT").

- 3 As the successor of the New York State
- 4 Teachers Association, the United Teachers of
- 5 New York State, Inc. and the NEA/NY, NYSUT
- 6 may also be publicly identified as "NYSUT
- 7 NEA-AFT".

ARTICLE II OBJECTIVES

8 This constitution is adopted for the following9 purposes:

- To promote the best interests of schools,
 higher education, and health care institutions
 of the state and to expand and improve these
 facilities of the state;
- To identify and promote practices and
 strategies that enhance student achievement
 in safe and supportive learning environments;
- To advance the standards of professions
 whose members form an organizational
 affiliation with NYSUT;
- 4. To secure the conditions necessary to the
 greatest efficiency of our members and the
 institutions where they work;
- 23 5. To promote the economic, personal and
 24 occupational well-being and the welfare of
 25 our members;
- 26 6. To promote policies, programs and training that
 27 enhance participation by underrepresented
 28 minorities in organizational decision-making
 29 committees and governance bodies;
- 30 7. To promote mutual assistance and31 cooperation among the locals of NYSUT;

- 32 8. To promote the common aims and objectives
 33 of the American Federation of Teachers and
 34 the National Education Association;
- 35 9. To expose and fight all forms of racism and discrimination;
- 10. To support the principles of the Americanlabor movement;
- 39 11. To support a free trade union movement40 throughout the world.

ARTICLE III AFFILIATIONS

- 41 This organization shall affiliate with the
- 42 American Federation of Teachers, those
- 43 organizations mandated by the AFT's
- 44 constitution/bylaws, and the National Education
- 45 Association.

ARTICLE IV LOCALS & COUNCILS

46 1. **Definition**.

47 The local unit, as recognized by the a) Board of Directors of NYSUT, shall be 48 the group of members who hold 49 collective bargaining rights. The Board 50 of Directors may recognize other 51 52 groups which do not hold collective bargaining rights as local units. Only 53 one unit shall be recognized in any one 54 55 employment jurisdiction, with the exception that locals not competing for 56 57 the same category of membership may be recognized upon approval of the 58 Board of Directors after consultation 59 with the existing local unit(s). 60 b) The statewide student education 61 organization shall be recognized as a 62

local unit.

64	c)	NYSUT may form retiree councils.
65		The jurisdiction and responsibilities of
66		such councils shall be determined by
67		the NYSUT Board of Directors.

68 2. Recognition.

- a) Locals and councils will be required to
 maintain unified membership with: (1)
 NYSUT; (2) the American Federation of
 Teachers and those organizations
 mandated by the constitution and bylaws
 of the American Federation of Teachers;
 and (3) where eligible, the NEA.
- 76 b) Each local shall forward to NYSUT for 77 each current member of a local which 78 was affiliated with NYSUT as of 79 August 31, 2006, or which became affiliated with NYSUT after September 80 81 1, 2006, not as a result of unification with NEA/NY, full per capita dues for 82 NYSUT as specified in Article VI §1 83 and for AFT/NEA organization 84 membership in accordance with the 85 NEAFT national affiliate dues 86 87 agreement and a sum equal to the per capita dues for all non-members paying 88 an agency fee. 89
- 90 c) Each local shall forward to NYSUT for each current member of a local affiliated 91 92 with NEA/NY on or after April 1, 2005, per capita dues for NYSUT, as specified 93 in Article VI §1, and for AFT/NEA 94 organization membership in accordance 95 with the NEAFT national affiliate dues 96 agreement, and a sum equal thereto for 97 all non-members paying an agency fee. 98
- 99 Each local and each council constitution d) or bylaws shall contain a statement that 100 the local/council will show no 101 discrimination toward individuals on the 102 basis of sex, religion, color, race, marital 103 status, sexual orientation, gender identity, 104 105 national or ethnic origin, age, disability or political activities and beliefs. Each such 106 constitution or bylaws shall contain a 107 statement that the local or council, as may 108 be applicable, is affiliated with NYSUT, 109 the AFT and the NEA. 110
- e) Additional procedures and criteria for recognition of locals and councils by NYSUT are prescribed in Bylaw A adopted by the Representative

- Assembly and/or policies adopted by the Board of Directors.
- The Secretary-Treasurer shall file 117 f) charges against any local which does 118 not transmit its dues and equivalent 119 agency fee amount in a timely manner. 120 121 Any local, and any member thereof for whom a local fails to transmit dues 122 within sixty (60) days after their 123 payment by the member or their receipt 124 by the local through an approved dues 125 checkoff procedure, shall be considered 126 in bad standing. 127 The Board of Directors shall determine 128 g) the penalty for any local's failure to 129 transmit dues and/or equivalent agency 130 fee amount in a timely manner. Such 131 penalty may be termination of 132 recognition or any lesser penalty the 133 134

ARTICLE V MEMBERSHIP

136 Membership shall be obtained only through per capita payment by a local of the required 137 138 dues amount for any category of membership. Only persons for whom the appropriate per capita 139 dues have been paid shall be considered members 140 141 of NYSUT. 142 There shall be the following membership 143 categories: inservice, student, special and 144 associate. Individuals will be required to maintain unified membership with the American 145 Federation of Teachers, the NEA where eligible 146 and those organizations mandated by the 147 148 Constitution and Bylaws of NYSUT and the 149 American Federation of Teachers. No member shall be subject to discipline by 150

151 NYSUT without due process.

ARTICLE VIII REPRESENTATIVE ASSEMBLY

308 1. **Protocol.**

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- a) The Assembly shall meet at least once annually at a time and place determined by the Board of Directors and at such other times as prescribed in this Constitution.
 b) An avaat record of the proceedings.
- b) An exact record of the proceedings shall be made and shall be maintained at the headquarters of NYSUT.
- 317 On all roll call votes in the annual c) 318 Assembly, each local represented shall 319 be entitled to a number of votes equal to the membership as defined in Article 320 VIII, §3(b). In the election of officers 321 322 and directors, all voting shall be by roll call vote and each local represented 323 324 shall be entitled to the number of votes equal to the membership as defined in 325 Article VIII, §3(b). When a delegate 326 leaves the Assembly, her/his place in 327 the Assembly may be taken by an 328 alternate, if any has been certified as 329 330 provided in Article VIII, §2(a), and in the order as listed. No other transfer or 331 substitution of voting rights shall be 332 333 allowed.
- d) The Representative Assembly will 334 335 conduct all elections and roll-call votes by democratic processes that ensure 336 that every member is represented; that 337 preserve the individual integrity of 338 339 every delegate's vote; and that hold delegates accountable to members. In 340 NYSUT officer elections, the 341

356			of the provisions of the NYSUT
357			Constitution and Bylaws and each
358			provision of the Campaign and Election
359			Procedures which are claimed to be
360			violated, and (b) the facts supporting
361			each such violation. The decision from
362			the Elections Committee, responding to
363			the complaint, shall be in writing. Any
364			person aggrieved from a decision of the
365			NYSUT Elections Committee who
366			wishes to appeal the determination of
367			the NYSUT Elections Committee must
368			file, in writing, an appeal, within thirty
369			(30) days (absent a showing of
370			extenuating circumstances which shall
371			be set forth in the written appeal) from
372			the date the decision of the Elections
373			Committee is received, to the American
374			Federation of Teachers ("AFT")
375			(American Federation of Teachers,
376			Attn. Office of the Secretary-Treasurer,
377			555 New Jersey Ave. N.W.,
378			Washington, DC 20001) for processing
379			and determination in accordance with
380			the applicable procedures outlined in
381			Article VI, Section 14 of the

In the alter-289 290 native, the President, with the consent 291 of the Board of Directors, may engage an independent agency to conduct the 292 ballots and to count the votes. 293


