Long Beach School Employees Association: FOUR YEARS IS JUST TOO LONG!!

Members of Long Beach Schools Employees Association (LBSEA) rallied together Oct. 28-31 for an informational "picket" to tell the public that they have been working under the terms of an expired agreement for the past four years. Not only have members not seen an increase in our salaries for four years, but most employees have had their hours cut from 19¹/₂ to 17¹/₂ hours per week. In the same four years, top administrators have taken a total of 8 percent salary increases, and gave their law firm a 2 percent increase.

"We have only just begun. We will continue to BE BOLD, BE STRONG, BE COURAGEOUS and above all BE



UNITED. We MAKE A DIFFERENCE EVERYDAY in a child's life," said LBSEA President Bill Snow.

The next step is a "joint coalition" rally with teachers before the upcoming board meeting. Lloyd Berks, LBSEA's NYSUT labor relations specialist and Matt Jacobs, the Nassau Regional Office staff director, will attend to show NYSUT's support.
