SRP Leadership conference shows union solidarity

SRPs turned out in droves to attend the October 2018 SRP Leadership Conference in Albany, with 210 SRP sisters and brothers, including 75 first-time attendees, representing 63 locals. This high-energy group gathered to learn, celebrate unity and have fun, despite the relentless attacks on unions and the labor movement.

SRP Advisory Committee Chair Kim McEvoy kicked off the conference by telling attendees: "May everyone find this weekend enlightening, uplifting, educational and feel the empowerment of the union.

"This is our union. Yes. I will tell you the first three letters of 'union' are 'U... 'n... I.'" And if you think you're going to take away our union, we're going to say "the last two letters of 'union' are bring it 'ON.""

The Officer Cracker Barrel was moderated by the SRP At-Large Directors, with NYSUT President Andy Pallotta, Executive Vice President Jolene DiBrango, Second Vice President Paul Pecorale and Secretary-Treasurer Phillipe Abraham. Participants were delighted to have their questions answered by the NYSUT officers.

The plenary session gave SRP leaders an overview of organizing. At lunch

locals learned about VOTE-COPE, the union's voluntary political action fund and President Pallotta recognized 13 locals for their outstanding contributions to the fund.

address, Rev. Terrance Melvin, secretary-treasurer of the New York State AFL-CIO, told the audience we would not back down from the attacks on unions and we must never forget the struggles and hard work of the unionists who built, shaped and molded the dynamics of the union today.

NYSUT's SRP members of the year winners Margaret Dalton, United Federation of Teachers, and Stephen Rechner, Union of Clerical and Technical Staff at NYU were honored.

Once again, SRPs gave generously, raising \$3,000 for the NYSUT Disaster Relief Fund through raffle ticket sales of creatively designed baskets donated by locals.

The Oct. 12–14 **statewide SRP Leadership Conference** was held at the Desmond Hotel in Albany. (See page 1.)

Amendments to civil service law gives new member access and expands due process to more SRPs

Amendments to two portions of New York state civil service law benefits SRPs and their locals. Article 14 of Civil Service Law (also known as the Taylor Law) has been amended to give locals some important rights in the post-Janus environment. Employers are now required to inform local unions of new hires within **30 days**. The employer must provide the name, address, and building assignment of the new hire. Employers must also give bargaining unit members at least 30 minutes to meet with new hires. Both the new hire and union representative must be given release time to meet, so this allotted time is now part of the working day and does not have to interfere with lunch schedules or other scheduled times. Since these are new provisions of the law, it is important that locals proactively approach management if they do not receive the necessary information or release time. An improper practice charge may be filed at the Public Employment Relations Board if management does not comply.

Additionally, Section 75 of Civil Service Law has been amended to provide the same due process protections for NYSUT members who were appointed to positions in the labor class. Members who have been appointed to their positions for five years or longer now receive due process protection under the law. Section 75 requires an employer to bring written disciplinary charges, an opportunity for the member to respond, and the right to have the issue heard before a hearing officer. This protection is also retroactive and is now applied to current members who have been appointed to their positions for longer than five years.
