Legislative Action

NYSUT works on

behalf of New York educators, students, health care professionals, municipal employees and retirees to improve public education and health care and to protect the rights of members to practice their profession. The union lobbies to promote state funding for public education and health care, to draw attention to social justice causes, and galvanizes members with action alerts and lobby days. Among the many bills it has successfully advocated for: Safe Schools legislation to reduce violence in schools; the Dignity for All Students Act, to curtail bullying in schools; a retiree Cost-of-Living Adjustment; and the elimination of mandatory overtime for hospital nurses.

Research and Educational Services

NYSUT always works to make sure the voice of the practioner is heard on education issues. The union works closely with the Regents and State Education Department to influence policy based on sound education practice and research. Professional programs and resources, toolkits, research bulletins and the annual publication of *Educator's Voice* constantly keep members informed of proven trends and research. This is the best resource for the latest information on new testing requirements, certification issues, and economic trends that are useful for contract negotiations.
